Stepping-UP wrapped up this year's course with a talk on the "Power of Branding!"

On June 8, 2013 the *Stepping UP* program at Walnut Grove welcomed independent filmmaker and visual artist *Caroline Manalo* for a presentation on "*The Power of Branding*". Beginning with the history of the *Nike*, *Microsoft*, and *Pepsi* logos, these high school women studied the visual design and marketing strategy behind some of today's top corporate icons. Challenged to name a movie after being shown only one letter from the film title, the students learned how choosing the right font can lead to successful entertainment branding. The afternoon concluded with each student brainstorming ideas for a personal logo using initials and graphic elements to symbolize each one's personality and interests.
